#### **LOCAL PILGRIMAGE**

## Seeking Christ's Freedom Pilgrimage

On a brisk and sunny day last month 26 pilgrims journeyed from St. Paul's to Medina's Spring Grove Cemetery for the *Seeking Christ's Freedom Pilgrimage*. They explored how Jesus' resurrection is key to gaining freedom from sin and death. The day began with Morning Prayer, then, gathered under the shadow of a Civil War monument, the pilgrims listened attentively as parishioner Tana Alexander spoke about why, because of Jesus' resurrection, we can be fearless in the face of death.

The group moved into the stone chapel, built in 1883, for a reflection by Rev. Susan Tiffany on embracing spiritual freedom from the risen Christ who walks alongside us as He walked alongside two disciples on their way towards Emmaus (Luke 24.13-35). Following a refreshment break, Susan Will from St. Paul's used Revelation 19.1, 4-9 as the text for her reflection on God's promise of eternal life.

For the final reflection of the pilgrimage, the group assembled at the graves of Col. H.G. and Elizabeth Blake and Lt. Col. Herman and Martha Canfield where cemetery volunteers told of these couples' involvement in Medina's underground railroad, and the abolitionist movement. While at the graves, Randy Malick from St. Hilary in Fairlawn reflected on Galatians 4.1-7 and its focus on freedom from spiritual slavery through the resurrection, since "we are no longer [slaves], but God's child" (Galatians 4.7).

The pilgrimage concluded with noonday prayer, followed by a fellowship lunch in the parish hall of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Medina.



## **Advent is Upon Us**

**The Advent Wreath** is a circular garland of evergreen branches that represent life everlasting. The circle of the wreath has no beginning and no end.



There are four candles on the

Advent Wreath, three purple and one pink. Each week we will light an additional candle until all four candles are lit.

On the first Sunday of Advent, we light the first purple candle. It is typically called the "Prophecy Candle." With this candle we remember the prophets, primarily Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. This candle represents hope or expectation of the coming Messiah.

On the second Sunday of Advent, we light the second purple candle. This candle sometimes is called the "Bethlehem Candle," symbolizing Christ's manger. This candle represents love.

*On the third Sunday of Advent*, we light the pink candle or the "Shepherd's Candle." This candle represents joy.

*On the fourth Sunday of Advent*, we light the last purple candle, the "Angel's Candle." This candle represents peace.
