Visiting the Ancient World

Our Tuesday Bible study is just about finished with *The Book of Acts*, written by Luke as a companion to the gospel he wrote. It's been a fascinating, in-depth study of the birth of Christianity. Without *Acts* "we could not have reconstructed the course of Paul's intrepid missionary career or known how the gospel spread to strategic cities of the Roman World." (John Stott, *The Spirit, The Church, The World*, page 5). The gospel did spread, and amazingly so! In just a short time after the ministry and resurrection of Jesus, the Greco-Roman world was evangelized. Paul and his teams—yes, it was very much a collaborative movement—were key players.

On Tuesdays, those whom Paul Gaston calls our "scripture scholars" visit the ancient world in imagination. In May, a group of travelers, led by Susan Tiffany, will visit sites in Greece in reality. They will follow in the footsteps of Paul, calling to mind his dedicated evangelism, and—ideally, among other things—thus be reminded of just how wonderful it is to be brought into Christ's flock *and* to be sent out into the world in the power of the Spirit. May we who aren't making the trip nonetheless be similarly bowled over by the grace of God that propelled the apostles.

What Does the Book of Revelation Reveal?

In a new series, St. Paul's clergy will describe important contexts for understanding the Book of Revelation and suggest what we might "take away" from it as we celebrate the 40 days of Eastertide.

May 4 – "Revelations" Before & After the Book of Revelation

To approach the Book of Revelation, it helps to know about other Christian apocalypses—both those written both before the Book (I and II Thessalonians, the Synoptic Gospels, Jude, II Peter) and those written after the formation of the New Testament. What do they have in common with the Book of Revelation? How are they different? How does awareness of these other "revelations" clarify the distinctiveness of the Book of Revelation? *The Rev.
